Students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school. Students shared the following ideas:



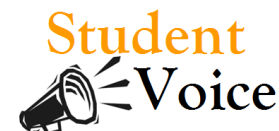
Students will provide parents with take home flyers of provided workshops.
