In the 1st Grade Classroom

The 1st Grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- ◆ Send home weekly word list consisting of spelling and sight words, books and other reading practice to provide opportunity for home practice
- ◆ Send home math homework as needed to provide opportunity for home practice
- ◆ The teacher will provide parents with a weekly newsletter stating current topics in Math and Reading

At Home




BWES parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success in Reading and Math

- ◆ Check student folders nightly
- ◆ Read to or with your child nightly
- ◆ Practice sight words and math facts nightly
- ◆ Listening Games with words (Beginning, Middle, and End sounds in words)
- ◆ Get students to bed on time
- ◆ Support teachers with discipline, social skills, and academics



Soaring Eagle Students

Students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school. Students shared the following ideas:

-  Give parents their daily folders that will include sight word list.
-  Complete homework and have an adult check over it.
-  Be accountable for behavior and turning in notes, daily folders, and work in each day.
