WPES 4th Grade Goals:



Goal 1: The percentage of 4th grade students at Proficient and/or Distinguish on the Math GMAS will increase from 20% to 25%.

Goal 2: The percentage of 4th grade students reading on or above grade level, as measured by GMAS, will increase from 64% to 69%.

Focus on grade-level text and vocabulary.

Teachers, Parents, Students– Working Together for Success

In the 4th Grade Classroom

The 4th Grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success. Some of our key connections with families will be:



Provide students with learning opportunities to increase fluency. Students use Xtra Math to practice fluency with families. Students will also be given a weekly spiral review to practice at home.



Send home a weekly fiction or non-fiction reading, fluency, or vocabulary passage to give home practice. Provide parents reading strategies to use when reading with their child at home.

At Home

WPES parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success.



Parents will practice multiplication facts with flash cards with their student.



Parents will listen to, read with, and utilize reading strategies provided by the teachers.



WPES 4th Grade Students

Students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school. Students shared the following ideas:



Students will study multiplication facts.



Students will complete reading passages for homework that practice the skills being taught in class using grade-level text.



Teachers, Parents, and Students believe these additional key points will create success for our 4th Graders this year:

1. Ask students about their day.
2. Sign up for Remind for reading and math classes.
3. Check planners for homework and quiz dates.
4. Encourage students to read in and above their Lexile level.
5. Practice math facts.
